Sharing our Inheritance!

You're sitting in a lawyer's office for the reading of your parents' will. You expect to be splitting your inheritance with your siblings, but then you're told you'll also be sharing it with someone unrelated to you—someone you find quite distasteful. Wouldn't you be shocked? speechless? furious? That's exactly what happened to the first followers of Christ, who were Jewish. God's chosen people, they believed that Christ came to redeem the children of Israel. And indeed he did. But as we hear today from Saint Paul, Christ also came for the Gentiles—the non-Jews. Saint Paul writes, "The Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus." This was difficult for Jesus' Jewish followers to absorb. The Gentiles were not related to the Jews by bloodline, so how could they also be chosen by God for Christ?

The Gospel story of the Magi also brought home this truth. The magi were Gentiles, and their coming signaled that Jesus was a light to *all* nations, not just Israel. This message of inclusivity was hard for Jesus' Jewish followers to hear, and it's difficult to hear today. How much time do Christians spend bickering among ourselves, labeling each other "conservative" or "liberal" and demonizing those we consider "less Christian"? Today's feast demands better of us. Until we give up the infighting, we're shrouded in darkness. Epiphany is about celebrating the light that Jesus is for all, and the light we Christians are called to be—together, as coheirs, copartners, and brothers and sisters in Christ.

FROM THE PASTOR:

What is man (a term which includes both male and female)? Man, a human being, is an image of God. Man is a creature composed of body and soul, and made to the image and likeness of God. Before the creation of man, God said, "Let us make man to our image and likeness; and let him have dominion over the fishes of the sea, and the fowls of the air, and the beasts, and the whole earth, and every creeping creature that moves upon the earth." (Genesis 1:26).

God formed the body of man from the dust of the earth; but He *breathed the soul* into man's body. In this way the soul came directly from God, and indicates our likeness to Him. It is in our souls rather than our bodies that we image a likeness to God. We should always reverence our likeness to God, trying to perfect it by making our souls as holy as possible. The enemies of a king once tried to make his son do something wrong. But the youth proudly and resolutely answered, "No! I am the son of the king!" By Baptism we become the adopted sons and daughters of God, Who is infinitely higher than any earthly king. Our soul is like our Father in Heaven.

The soul of man is different from the soul of brute animals. Animals do not have a spiritual soul. They have senses and instinct, but they do not have reason or free will. Reason (understanding) and free will are the two powers of the soul. Reason is the power of the soul to think. Free will is the power of the soul to choose whether to act or not to act.

If a horse has not eaten for a day, and you put some hay before him, he will eat, because his instinct moves him to do so. But a hungry man may fast for days, and still refuse to eat no matter how hungry he may be, if he *wills* not to eat. The difference between man's free will and animal instinct is that a man can say "No" to himself. The soul and the body are not loosely connected parts of man; they are *united* in a substantial union. The soul is not located in any particular member of the body, but is whole and entire in each part.

Like God, our human soul is *an immortal spirit*, with understanding and free will. Some deny the existence of the soul, because it cannot be seen; yet the same people would not deny the existence of human reason, even if this cannot be seen, either. Through our two faculties of the soul, understanding and free will, man obtains dominion over the material world, as God possesses power over the entire universe. God said before creating man: "Let him have dominion over the beasts and the whole earth" (Genesis 1:26). Through our likeness to God we have the power to know the true, the good, the beautiful, and even to know the Source of all truth, goodness, and beauty, God Himself.

Some indications that the soul is immortal (cannot die):

1. Our acts of intelligence are spiritual; therefore, our soul must be a spiritual being, not dependent on matter, and hence not subject to decay or death.
2. Man has mind and will. We can reflect, reason, plan for the future, make judgments, remember. These prove our soul to be spiritual. Such a soul cannot die as the body does. Man longs for an ideal state of perfect happiness, such happiness as is impossible to attain on earth. This universal longing must have been placed in our souls by God Himself; it is a desire for the infinite happiness of a union with the Creator. If man's soul were not immortal, he would have no chance to realize his dream of bliss, and God would be cruel in implanting the longing for it in his breast.
3. There have been many instances of the dead appearing to the living. In the Gospel, Moses and Elijah appeared on Mount Tabor to Christ and three of His Apostles. At Christ's death, many who were dead rose and appeared in Jerusalem. The Blessed Virgin has through the centuries continued to appear to men; such instances are almost innumerable. Saints have also returned to earth to comfort or instruct the living; even souls in purgatory have returned, to beg for prayers. We must, however, be very careful about believing in particular instances of appearances by the dead; the devil can and often does use this to trick the gullible.
4. Belief in the immortality of the soul and life after death is universal among mankind, including the most primitive peoples. In the Bible are many instances of the belief of the Jews in another life, where the souls of the dead would be. The Greeks and Romans believed in Tartarus and Elysium, places for the dead. Other nations have different cults to the dead, especially during their burial ceremonies. Such cults would be meaningless if those who took part in them did not have an idea of another life for departed souls.
5. If the soul were not immortal, the wicked who commit evil all their lives would go unpunished. The just who suffer continually on earth would not receive any reward. This would be *injustice* impossible to the perfect justice of God.
6. Holy Scripture, the Word of God, teaches that the soul is immortal. Our Lord Himself said to the good thief, "This day you shall be with Me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43). "And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul" (Matthew 10:28). "He is not the God of the dead, but of the living" (Matthew 22:32).
