Taizé is a small village in Burgundy, France. It was here, during World War II in 1940, a man was searching. He wanted to understand how to live today FOR GOD. Brother Roger Schultz felt that a group of truly dedicated Christians could move mountains and could change the world. He felt called to live a common life and to work for those in need. The beauty and simplicity of his own life drew others to join him. Today, they are an ecumenical community of some 90 members, including Catholics, Anglicans, and Protestants from over 20 countries, rooted in the monastic tradition.

Thousands of young adults go to Taizé each week to study the Scriptures and to pray. They come from many different countries all over the world. The brothers wanted to find a way that visitors would not just be spectators, but could share in their prayer. They devised song-prayers which are often sung in Latin, so those from different countries can be equally “uncomfortable.” The Taize Prayer service is based on the evening prayer at Taizé on Fridays. The repetitious songs, almost like a mantra, will become our prayer.
